### **Parent Council Meeting**

### We met before the half term and the following actions were agreed:

- \*To look into Tesco and F&F as a distributor of uniform and for us all to consider the feasibility of a uniform swap particularly of kilts in the summer term.
- \*School to consider separate entrances one at front and one at back of new build for Y1 and Reception due to morning and evening gridlock on narrow pathways to the doors. LF to feedback at the beginning of the new half term.
- \*School to look into feasibility of installing lockers instead of coat pegs in school to reduce amount of lost property and to ensure cloakrooms and corridors are tidy. LF to feedback. School to also look into supply of new book bags and PE bags.
- \*LF to ensure teaching staff allow time at end of day for parents to enter classroom (with teacher supervision) to search for lost belongings.
- \*Parent council in future meetings to agree on 1-3 © charitable partnerships over the course of the year to ensure focussed, meaningful and purposeful fund raising.
- \*LF to feedback to site maintenance team on lighting for pathways and quad in light of new collection and drop off arrangements over winter months as well as addressing the quagmire that has developed on entrance into school path near astro.
- \*Finance team to look into costings of Arbor for comms and payments for next academic year. Finance to clarify why payments cannot be made in bulk and to increase amount that can be paid for on parent pay. LF to feedback to parent council.
- \*LF to raise with teaching staff the need to address any misconceptions or inappropriate comments children may hold based on chosen snacks. LF to reiterate the importance of educating all of our children of the need for a nutritional and balanced diet in line with national curriculum requirements.
- \*LF to communicate to EYFS and KS1 parents our medicine policy in line with current safeguarding regulatory procedures.
- \*LF to look into feasibility of keeping an outside notice board up to date with the latest letters.
- \*For Y1 staff to host a parental engagement session in Autumn 2 ideas to be communicated in due course.
