

UW, CL

You could make the tiger come to your house! Search for 'tiger' in Google and then go to 'View in 3D'. It's amazing!

CLL, PSED

Discuss the story together.

Can you remember some of the things the tiger ate / drank?

Have you had a visitor at your house? Who was it? What did you do to get ready for your visitor coming? Did you have any special food?

How do you think Sophie's Mummy felt when she answered the door to the tiger?



EAD, PD

Can you make a tiger using an empty toilet roll tube? You can decorate your tiger with a felt tip pen to give him / her some stripes.

MD, CL, UW, PD

When the tiger came to Sophie's house, he drank all the water from the tap! That's a lot of water! See if you can find out how many cups of water it takes to fill a jug. Count each one as you pour it in. You can try cups and jugs of different sizes to see if that makes a difference.

You will need a washing up bowl or a bucket of water, some cups / beakers and jugs / pans. This is probably best done outside but you can work in the sink if a grown up is supervising.

PSED, MD, L, PD

Have a tea party with your family. Decide before hand what you are going to eat and drink so that you can write a shopping list together.

How many plates do you need?

How many cups do you need?

Where are we going to have the tea party?

What will we do if the tiger comes to visit?

Do any of the foods begin with 't'?

L, UW, PD, MD, PSED

Make some cupcakes for a tea party! I have used this recipe and it works a treat!
