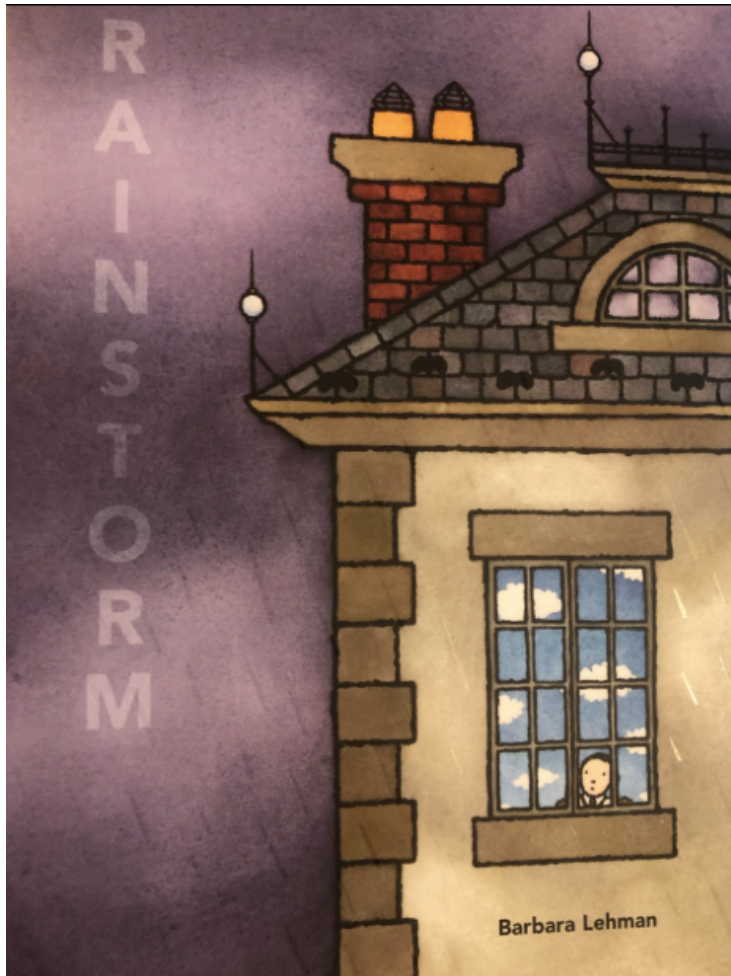


Week 1 WC 20.04.2020

Literacy- To ask questions and write sentences about a new text.

Activity 1



Look at the front cover of Rainstorm from our 'imagine' bookshelf, share and discuss what you notice (grown ups see my worked example on PowerPoint to encourage children's ideas.) What do you think the story may be about? What is a rainstorm? Have you ever seen a rainstorm? What noises can you hear? What might you see? Do you like rainstorms? Why?

Using question starters- **who, what, where, why, how**, think of questions you would like to find the answers to about the book. Write two/three questions don't forget to use a question mark.

Extra challenge:

- Can you think of some adjectives to describe a rainstorm?
- Write a sentence about why you like/dislike rainstorms using the word because.

Activity 2



Look at the picture above - write three sentences about what is happening the picture.

Think about how does the boy feel?
What is the boy doing?
What has he go in his house?

Example sentences –

The boy looked out of the window. Describe the weather/tell me what he could see.
The boy had lots of toys. Can you use **but** why is the boy not playing with his toys?
They boy had no one to play with. How did he feel?

Check you have used capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, phonics and checked it makes sense.

Extra challenge-

- Draw a picture of what the boy can see outside of his window.
- Can you write sentences to describe what he can see?
