This week, we are learning about the suffix -ness

A suffix is a group of letters we can join onto the end of a word to change it into a new word.

We can change an adjective (describing word) into a noun (thing) by adding the suffix -ness.

Example:

kind + ness = kindness

The most important thing is kindness.

If the adjective ends in 'y' e.g. happy, we take off the y and change it to an i

So happy + ness = happiness
