Science- Animals, including humans

Activity 1:

Last half term we were learning about living things. We talked about the 7 things that all living things do. Can you remember them?

Here are some pictures of living things. Can you write the name of each living thing you can see?














Then can you sort the names of the living things into 2 groups: plants and animals?


Watch it again if you need to, then write the 4 things that all animals need to survive. Draw a picture to represent each thing e.g. for food, you could draw a bowl of food.

Art – Printing using repeated patterns

Activity 1

Look at these pictures.

What is the same about them? What is different? Which one do you like the best?







The three pictures use repeating patterns. One pattern or picture which is repeated over and over again to make the whole picture.

Lots of artists use this technique, as well as designers of fabric, wallpaper and wrapping paper.

Complete this repeating pattern by drawing the same shape into each box. You could copy this into your book if it's easier.

Activity 2

Decide on a shape or picture to draw in the first box, then repeat it in all the other boxes to create a repeated pattern. I can't wait to see your designs!
