Adding suffixes to words- This is revision of work that we have done together.

- ROOT WORD: forget, forgot, begin, hop, chop, shop, prefer. The root word is the word that we start with before we add anything to it.
- When we add our suffix (added to the end of the word) our root words change. Forgetting, forgotten, beginning, beginner, hopping, hopped, chopping, chopped, shopping, preferred
- The rule that we know and have learnt is that when a root word ends in a consonant, we need to double the consonant and add our suffix.
- Example begin, n is consonant so we double it nn and add the suffix ing.
 - Beginning

Spelling Rule	Example Words
1) The silent —e at the end of the root word is dropped when adding a suffix beginning with a vowel letter , except being.	nicest
2) When a word ends in a y , change the y to i before the suffix is added but not before -ing .	happiest
