I have highlighted expanded noun phrases in green and fronted adverbials in orange to help me to remember to include them in my writing.

What do trolls look like?	Ogre, huge, fierce, ugly but, kind, beautiful to others. <i>Small, beady eyes, bulbous warty nose, sharp, yellow teeth.</i> Most, <i>long, curly horns</i> , like goat. <i>Interestingly</i> , few trolls, no horns.
