# The Truth about Trolls – Boxing up

Heading: The Truth About Trolls Introduction to get reader interested in topic	<b>Angry, mean beasts</b> , terrify goats <b>However</b> , not true, Here is the truth
What do trolls look like?	Ogre, huge, fierce, ugly but, kind, beautiful to others. <b>Small, beady eyes, bulbous warty nose, sharp, yellow teeth</b> . Most, <b>long, curly horns</b> , like goat. <b>Interestingly</b> , few trolls, no horns.
Where do trolls live?	Usually cold, Iceland. Caves near volcanoes, warmth and shelter. Peacefully, small family groups, hidden. One troll, grumpy, wooden bridge, bullied local goats, gave trolls bad name.
What do trolls eat?	Enjoy types of seafood. Fish in darkness, not seen. Eat food raw, sometimes, volcanoes erupt cook food on hot rocks. <b>In addition</b> , mushrooms, juicy roots. <b>Surprisingly</b> , goats not on menu.
Did you know? <i>Keep your best facts for the end!</i>	<b>Amazingly</b> , trolls like to have fun, Singing, dancing. Sing, rumble of thunder, dance like an earthquake. <b>Sadly</b> , because of troll, hide from view. Still be seen, look really hard and believe. Rocks, sleeping trolls

Underlying Structure	<b>Angry, destructive beasts</b> petrify animals and people. <b>However</b> , not true. Here is the truth about trolls.

What do trolls look like?	<b>Huge, strong</b> , people think, gruesome and scary, <b>actually</b> , kind and helpful. <b>Tiny, round eyes</b> , shine. <b>Huge, warty noses. Pointy, yellow teeth</b> , sharp as a knife. <b>Often</b> , two <b>hairy, pink horns</b> .
Where do trolls live?	<b>Most or the time</b> , living in <b>deep, dark caves</b> hide away from people who shout, scream. Build caves near volcanoes, warmth and shelter. Trolls live peacefully, happily. <b>A long time ago, grumpy, old troll</b> scared goats. People think, mean and horrible.
What do trolls eat?	Assume, <b>slimy, smelly food</b> guts, bones, not true. <b>Fresh, green leaves</b> and fruit. Apples are favourite. <b>In addition</b> , pick mushrooms heat up on hot rocks erupted from volcanoes. <b>Surprisingly</b> , they don't eat meat.
Did you know? <i>Keep your best facts for the end!</i>	<b>Amazingly</b> , trolls love to draw. Fantastic artists draw what they see, each other, landscapes and volcanoes. <b>Sadly</b> , because people think trolls <b>mean, nasty beasts</b> , artwork is hidden, never seen.
