Activity 2: We have received the letter below from PCSO Amy Mair. Macclesfield Police would like to know a bit more about you and what you have been up to during lockdown.

Try to think back to your first term in Year 5 when we wrote letters as Rose Blanche. Let's try to include some of those skills in this letter too.

Skills to use:

Subordinate clauses at the beginning or end of a sentence (as, when, because, whilst, if) Example: Because of the lockdown, I couldn't go to my friend's party OR I couldn't go to my friend's party because of the lock down.

Modal verbs – (would, could, should, wouldn't, couldn't, will, won't)

Example - I can't wait to get back to school

Relative clauses introduced with a relative pronoun (who, which, that) and in parenthesis.

Example – My brother, who is older than me, keeps hogging the TV.

I have written an example letter for you to give you some ideas of how you can structure your writing.
