<u>MY FAVOURITE PART</u> Write about your favourite part of your book and explain why you like it using evidence from the text	<u>NEW COVER</u> Design a new cover for the book. Include a picture, title, author and illustrator.	<u>WRITE A LETTER</u> Write a letter to one of the characters in your reading book. Include at least one question you want to ask them
<u>POINT OF VIEW</u> Retell part of the story from a different character's point of view.	<u>QUIZ</u> Make up at least five questions about your reading book. Make sure you know the answers! Inference Questions

Example: After the storm, Michael had trouble keeping his car on the slippery road. Question: Why was the road slippery? The road was slippery because during the storm there would have been rain which would have left water on the road.

1. Grandpa's dog, Milly, had not been near water and soap for many months. Question: What did the dog look like?

2. My jumper rippled and I struggled to control my kite as it dipped through the air. Question: What was the weather like?

3. Daniel leaned on the shovel breathing hard as he inspected the depth of the new hole in the ground.

Question: What had Daniel been doing?

4. We all stopped talking when Mr Martin entered the classroom and began to take the register.

Question: Who is Mr Martin?

5. After completing the cross country mountain bike race in the rain, I washed my bike thoroughly.

Question: Why did the mountain bike need to be washed thoroughly?
