Prefixes: dis- non- un-



A prefix is a word part that is added to the front of a root word to change the meaning of that word. Remember to use a hyphen when using non.

Examples:

The prefixes *dis-*, *non-*, and *un-* mean "not" or "the opposite of"

dis + approve = disapprove (not approve)
non + toxic = non-toxic (not toxic)
un + happy = unhappy (not happy)
